THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Have you ever attended an inauguration or watched an inauguration ceremony on television? When a president of the United States has been newly elected, he participates in a formal ceremony of inauguration and presents an inaugural address.

In this speech he explains his role in leading the country, and shares his hopes and his plans for the future. Jesus’ baptism was similar to an inauguration.

One day Jesus was standing in a crowd listening to John the Baptist. John always challenged his listeners to turn their backs on their sinful way of life and turn to God. A sign that a person really wanted to live according to God’s way was his or her public baptism by John. When a person stood beside John in the water, everyone in the crowd expected that person to change for the better. After all the people had come forward that day to be baptized, Jesus came forward. This was confusing to John the Baptist. He knew that Jesus did not need to change the way he was living. But the Gospel records that when Jesus was baptized, a very important thing happened – some signs showed that the Father and the Spirit were in intimate connection with Jesus.

Jesus was anointed for his mission just as Isaiah had written: “The spirit of the Lord God is upon to me, because the Lord has anointed me” (Isaiah 61:1), Jesus quoted the rest of that passage to explain his mission when he spoke to his neighbors at Nazareth:

He has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor. (Luke 4:18-19)

Jesus, who did the Father’s work, was always one with the power of the Father and the Holy Spirit. After rising from the dead, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit upon his

disciples at Pentecost. Then their work of spreading the Good News of Jesus began.

Jesus’ baptism by John was his inauguration for his mission to save all people from their sins. This mission would result in Jesus’ Passion and death on the cross, to be followed by his Resurrection from the dead. The Gospel records that on his way to Jerusalem, he spoke about his Passion and death as a baptism. “I have a baptism with which to be baptized, and what stress I am under until it is completed!” (Luke 12:50).

The source of grace received in Christian Baptism is the death and Resurrection of Christ Jesus. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we have been baptized into Christ’s death (the death that saved us) and have become God the Father’s adopted children. As baptized members of the Christian community, we also have a mission – to spread the Good News of Jesus by the way we speak and act. When we celebrate the feast of Jesus’ baptism, we can also celebrate our own initiation, our own Baptism.

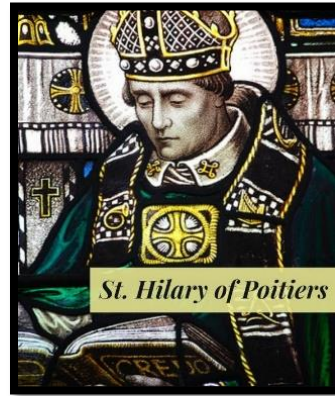
Confirmation Fee of \$50 is in addition to registration. If you have not submitted your Confirmation Fee yet, please submit it during January.

ST. HILARY OF POITIERS

This saint was charged with disturbing the peace! Yet everyone who knew Hilary said he was a friendly, charitable, and gentle man.

Hilary was born to pagan parents of Poitiers, France. After studying philosophy and the Greek and Roman classics, Hilary married. He and his wife had one daughter, Afra. Hilary’s studies led him to read the Scriptures. He became convinced that there was only one God whose Son became man and died and rose to save all people. So Hilary, with his wife and daughter, was baptized into the Christian faith.

The people of Poitiers were impressed with the example of Hilary and chose him to be their bishop in 353. He was an able administrator, and a pastor and bishop who spoke out against Arianism. He warned the people of this heresy that denied the divinity of Christ. When the Emperor Constantius II wanted Hilary to sign a paper condemning Athanasius, the great defender of the faith, Hilary refused. The emperor was furious and exiled Hilary to Phrygia in Asia Minor.

In exile Hilary did even greater good through his preaching, writing, and suffering. During this time he requested a debate with the Arian bishops. Fearing Hilary’s strong arguments, the Arians begged the emperor to send Hilary Home. The emperor, believing Hilary was also undermining his authority, recalled him.

Hilary’s writings show that he could be fierce in defending the faith, but in dealing with the bishops who had given in to the Arian heresy, he was very charitable. He showed them their errors and helped them to defend the truths of the faith. Though the emperor called him “disturber of the peace,” Saints Jerome and Augustine praised him as “teacher of the churches.”

POPULAR DEVOTIONAL PRACTICES: BASIC Q & A'S

What is the relationship between popular devotions and the Bible? As the Bible stands at the core of what God has revealed to the Church, sound popular devotions should naturally be strongly imbued with biblical themes, language, and imagery. Pope Paul VI explained, “Today it is recognized as a general need of Christian piety that every form of worship would have a biblical imprint.” He applied this in particular to the example of Marian devotions: “What is needed is that texts of prayers and chants should draw their inspiration and their wording from the Bible, and above all that devotion to the Virgin should be imbued with the great themes of the Christian message.” In speaking of the Rosary, Pope John Paul II insisted that is not a substitute for the reading of the Bible; “on the contrary, it presupposes and promotes” prayerful reading of the Holy Scriptures. While the mysteries of the Rosary “do no more than outline the fundamental elements of the life of Christ, they easily draw the mind to a more expansive reflection on the rest of the Gospel, especially when the Rosary is prayed in a setting of prolonged recollection.”
